
FROM THE DESKS OF THE CCTST DIRECTORS – November 2022

The CCTST has enhanced our **Consultation Services** within our services portal **Research Central**, to include **learning health systems** (LHS) and **dissemination & implementation science**. Researchers can now seek guidance regarding designing and implementing an LHS, including 1) shared purpose, goals, and theory of change; 2) data collection, infrastructure, and analytics; 3) stakeholder engagement and coproduction with patients and families; 4) integration of clinical care, research, and improvement activities; and 5) leadership, governance, and ethics. Additionally, new and experienced researchers who want to explore ideas on how to build dissemination and implementation science into research projects can access a consultation with experts in the field.

Community Leader's Institute (CLI): Applications are now open for the Community Engagement Core's CLI. The Community Leaders Institute (CLI) is a leadership development training program offered over five consecutive weeks in February– March. The goal is to build research and leadership skills that the individual can use to improve or develop a health program. Training sessions are designed to build leadership and research/program evaluation skills in the following areas: Grant Writing; Accessing Public Datasets; Program Evaluation; Quality Improvement; Survey Development & Assessing Community Health Needs; Design Thinking; and Research Ethics. Participants receive a small grant (\$1,500-\$2,000) and have the opportunity to apply the skills learned to a healthrelated project (to be completed over the next 12 months).
