Background

- Significant rise in cases, nationally and locally
 - Hamilton County- 280 cases in 2021, 531 in 2022
- Initial symptoms mild or undetectable
- Latent syphilis can affect all body systems
- Easily treatable



Testing Landscape

• 2022- UCMC ED


- 2059 people tested for gonorrhea and chlamydia
 - 18% positive tests
- 3561 people tested for HIV
 - 1% positive tests
- Only 264 tested for syphilis
 - 8% positive tests



Objectives


- 1. Increase testing for syphilis in the ED
 - Modify EHR
 - Prompting of healthcare team by health promotion advocates
- 2. Determine prevalence of syphilis in the ED population
- 3. Explore factors associated with positive syphilis cases
