CCTST Acute Care Research Core (ACRC) Pilot Grant – Letters of Intent Due September 8, 2023. The ACRC's mission is to advance patient outcomes in the challenging and fast-paced acute care setting by empowering our stakeholders, improving research efficiency, training the next generation of clinical and translational researchers, and developing acute care research standards of care. The CCTST Community Engagement Core is now accepting letters of intent and proposals for the **2024 Community Health Grants and Partnership Development Grants.**

The Community Health Grant program offers grants of up to \$20,000 for translational research conducted by partnerships consisting of both academic and community organizations/programs or physician practices that improve health outcomes in children, adults, and/or the community. The Partnership Development Grant program offers grants of up to \$5,000 focused on the development or strengthening of collaborations between community and academic partners. Letters of Intent (*strongly encouraged*) are due **August 30**, **2023**. Final Proposals due **October 18**, **2023**.
